The Take - Avi Lewis and Naomi Klein - 2004

In the wake of Argentina's spectacular economic collapse, Latin America's most prosperous middle class finds itself in a ghost town of abandoned factories and mass unemployment. Thirty unemployed auto-parts workers walk into their idle factory in Buenos Aires, roll out sleeping mats and refuse to leave. All they want is to re-start the silent machines....

Dark Days - Marc Singer - 2000

A fascinating glimpse of the lives of a community of homeless people surviving in a train tunnel in Manhattan. Dark Days attacks our wastefulness and insensitivity to the underprivileged, and is enhanced by the use of humor and understatement. The movie took Singer six years to make with no money, equipment or knowledge of filmmaking.

The Wobblies - Stewart Bird and Deborah Shaffer - 1979

Eerily echoing current times, The Wobblies boldly investigates a nation torn by naked corporate greed and the red-hot rift between the industrial masters and the rabble-rousing workers in the field and factory. The Wobblies is a rare and challenging invitation to rethink both past and present through the eyes of an organization largely omitted from memory.

We - "Arundhati Roy" - 2003`

We is a completely free documentary, created (and released) anonymously on the internet. It visualizes the words of Arundhati Roy, specifically her famous Come September speech, where she spoke on such things as the war on terror, corporate globalization, justice and the growing civil unrest.
